



Save Your Friend's Life Over the Air Waves Contest 2009 Entry Form

The purpose of the contest, conducted by the New York State Association of Traffic Safety Boards (NYSATSB), is to identify five radio spots/Public Service Announcements (PSAs) that will persuade teens to make life-saving choices to prevent injuries and deaths due to car crashes.

Who is Eligible? Entries will be accepted from high school students, organizations and groups in grades 9 – 12. Home-schooled students may also enter the contest.

How Do You Enter the Contest?

Submit this entry form and your thirty-second radio spot/PSA for one of the topic areas on an audio CD. Each CD must be accompanied by an entry form. Label the CD with your name(s) or organization/class name, school name, county and topic area. Include this information and a script of your recorded message on a separate sheet of paper. Only one entry and thirty-second radio spot per CD. There is no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted.

What will the Winners Receive?

One winner will be selected for each topic area. Each winner will receive a cash award, state and local recognition and their message(s) aired on radio stations statewide.
