The meeting was opened by Tom Jenkins, Chairman, at 10:07 a.m.

Minutes of the last meeting were accepted.

The Chairman reported on the Upper Hudson River Task Force's involvement with the Stewart's Bridge Niagara Mohawk project which will begin in July and run until October if all goes as planned. He has been appointed to a sub-committee with Saratoga County to make recommendations which were read. One of which was to modify Ni Mo's notification flow chart so that the initial notification would be to the Warren County Sheriff's Office and they will do the necessary dispatching.

Dr. Donald Sheeley introduced himself to the Committee. He will be replacing Dr. Robinson.

Our office has also been mandated to update all the Dam Plans in Warren County. The National Weather Service provided us with a list of all the dams and letters have been sent to all the Departments of Public Works requesting what information they have.

We arranged to purchase a new repeater for RACES for Prospect Mountain as they needed to update their license due to the death of the authorized licensee. We also provided them with a mobile with the County frequency.

Our office also attended two more meetings with BOCES and school officials regarding their mandated emergency plans.

Our chairman continues to meet with the Red Cross Disaster Committee. He also attended a multi-chapter meeting in Keesville which focused on disaster response.

A letter from the State's legal counsel regarding LEPC liability was read.

Ron Davies brought up the subject of Assembly Bill A10625 which requires users of interruptable gas service to install alternative fuel service on their site and to maintain at least 30 days inventory of alternative fuel. Ames Goldsmith feels that this is dangerous and unnecessary and has contacted as many legislators as possible opposing it. He wanted to bring it to the Committee's attention and requested their assistance by writing also.

The Committee members introduced themselves to Dr. Sheeley.

It was agreed that our next meeting should be after Labor Day, therefore, our next meeting will be on Tuesday, September 11 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 6-103 at the Municipal Center.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40 a.m.
