The meeting was called to order at 9:35 a.m.

Mr. Jenkins recently toured Ames Goldsmith and received an updated copy of their emergency plan.

The State passed a law that all towns had to have an emergency plan in place by December 31st. All our towns have had plans for many years and we assist them in updating them on an annual basis.

The Chairman passed on information received from the State Emergency Management Office on courses of interest to emergency management and LEPC members.

The LEPC has received \$1,325.00 this year for planning expenses, and this is supposed to continue each year for five years. We are using it for computer support, etc. on the EISC software supplied to us by the State.

The Northern District Civil Defense Directors Association has been appointed as the Technology Committee for the New York State Emergency Management Association. We have had our first meeting during which we discussed inventorying and possible sharing of equipment. Marv Lemery said that the Firefighters Association is also working toward standardizing communications equipment.

Mr. Jenkins is also the Disaster Chairman for the Adirondack Chapter of American Red Cross and we are now in the process of updating all their shelter agreements.

He touched on some minor flooding problems which occurred up North.

The Chairman asked about the status of the Finch Pruyn drill. Phil Arthur said there are a few things still to be ironed out.
