DESIGNATING WARREN COUNTY SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION
DISTRICT AS THE LEAD AGENCY TO PROTECT WARREN
COUNTY'S WATER RESOURCES FROM
NON-POINT SOURCE POLLUTION

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (N.Y.S. D.E.C.) has statewide responsibility for water quality planning and will need local agencies to be in charge of the program locally, and

WHEREAS, the Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) was formed in accordance with New York State Law, for the conservation of soil resources and the control and prevention of soil erosion, which are problems of public concern, and

WHEREAS, the Warren County Soil and Water Conservation District has carried on an active program on erosion and sediment control and water quality management by developing and implementing plans with individuals and units of government over the past 33 years, and has a Long-Range Plan, developed in cooperation with Warren County and other local and state agencies, that outlines the District's future program to provide valued services to help solve natural resource problems in Warren County, and

WHEREAS, since the Warren County Soil and Water Conservation District was designated by Resolution No. 55 of 1979 of the Warren County Board of Supervisors as the responsible agency for erosion and sediment control and water quality management on potential non-point pollution sources such as streambanks, construction, forestry, mined land, roadbanks, and
