

- State establishes ConnectAll Program
- FCC's first step in allocating BEAD money: accurate mapping of serviceable locations (BSLs) and provider coverage. Lengthy and complex "challenge" process is undertaken by Planning Dept and LCLGRPB

2024

- LCLGRPB is provided with \$220,000 grant from NBRC to conduct planning in its 5 County region
  - Challenge process continues
  - ConnectAll Office releases 5-year BEAD Action Plan


- LCLGRPB launches development of Regional Broadband Deployment Plan
- Challenge process continues and finally concludes
- State develops draft grant areas for BEAD funding

**96%** of households in Warren county have broadband availability

- DRAFTED GRANT AREAS FOR BEAD FUNDING
