#### **Temporary Assistance**

The Temporary Assistance unit consists of Social Welfare Examiners, an intake clerk and two Case Managers along with the Principal and two Senior examiners. Their responsibilities to the community include determining applicant's eligibility for various resources of the unit based on their income and circumstance, Some individuals qualify for cash assistance, rental and utility assistance, Emergency housing, food and medical determinations. maintenance of those who are open and receiving services, and case management, and emergency housing needs. In 2023 the Unit processed 1,830 applications and 1,399 unscheduled emergencies/ complex cases.

The TA Unit has had to overcome a large increase in walk-in emergencies and the constant adaptation to policy changes and directives that come from the state.

#### Did You Know?



Have you been Watching the 2024 Olympics in Paris? Simone Biles— US Olympic Gymnast is Breaking records. She is a real story of Resilience!!!

Biles was born on March 14, 1997, in Columbus, Ohio, the third of four siblings. Her birth mother, Shanon Biles, was unable to care for Simone or her other children. All four went in and out of foster care. In 2000, Biles' maternal grandfather, Ron Biles, and his second wife, Nellie Cayetano Biles, began caring temporarily for Shanon's children in the north Houston suburb of Spring, Texas, after learning his grandchildren were in foster care. In 2003, the couple formally adopted Simone and her younger sister Adria. Ron's sister, Harriet, adopted the two oldest children. ~ Wikipedia.

Simone reports falling in the love with the sport of Gymnastics while on a field trip with her daycare class. She has pursued her passion ever since. Simone's advice to young girls : "I would say dream big and then, after that, dream bigger, because I never thought in a million years I would be doing what I'm doing, because I just wanted to do college gymnastics, get a college scholarship. And then once I kind of got to that point, I was like, OK, how far can I take it?" said Biles of her advice to the next generation. "And, then, I got to worlds and I was like, OK, maybe the Olympics. And now it's like five years later, two Olympics.

While Simone was competing in the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo, She decided to take herself out of the competition due to some mental health symptoms she was having. Since then, she has come back stronger than ever and has added Mental Health Advocate to her "routine". "It's really important to use that support system and know they're there for you and not against you, because at the end of the day, us as humans, we hate asking for help," Biles said. "We think we can do it on our own, but sometimes we just can't. So use every outlet given to you."

"I hope young women take away that it's OK to not be OK. You can speak up for what you believe, and you can do things alone," she said. "It's OK to kind of be shot down. Sometimes, it's how you get up and pick yourself back up and that women are strong alone. They don't really need anybody else. But I just think it's really powerful and the strength that you see in this show – hopefully, girls can walk away with that."
