

COUNTRYSIDE ADULT HOME  
Visitation during Covid-19

**POLICY:**

Countryside Adult Home will resume resident and family visitation in accordance with all CDC guidelines and Department of Health Directives.

**PROCEDURE:**

- a) Visitation will be Monday thru Friday from 1pm to 5pm, by appointment only. Once you have arrived at the facility either call 518-623-3451 or ring the doorbell. A staff member will meet you at the front of the building.
- b) Visitors are required to complete a health screening, including a temperature check, provided a Visitor Fact Sheet, and an acknowledgement of the visitation policy. These forms will be kept on a secure file for review by Department of Health. Countryside's Q&A team, comprised of The Deputy Commissioner, The Director, The Case Manager and The Activity Aide, will meet on a regular basis to review compliance and update the policy as necessary. Facility updates will be put on Countryside's Facebook page, as well as the Warren County Website.
- c) Visits will be outside in designated areas. There are areas that are covered if weather is a factor. Visitors and residents must wear face coverings at all times. We ask you that have your own face covering but the facility will provide one if necessary. Social distancing must be followed. Areas have been measured and are indicated by red tape. Hand sanitizer will be provided. Each visit will be 45 minutes to ensure enough time for staff to complete sanitation measures before the next scheduled visit.
- d) In order to accommodate visitation for all residents' visits will be on a rotating schedule.
- e) Countryside staff will observe all visits for compliance. Staff reserves the right to end the visit at any time if the visitation policy is not followed. Any visitor that fails to adhere to the visitation policy will be prohibited from visiting during the duration of the COVID-19 state declared public health emergency.
- e) Countryside Adult Home reserves the right to pause visitation if it feels community based positive COVID rates are on the rise and could be detrimental to residents and staff. Please note, if there is a resident or staff positive case, the facility must have a period of 28 days of no new cases prior to resuming visitation.
