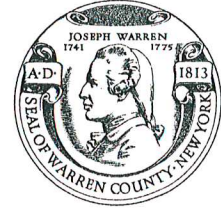

LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER 6

TEMPORARY SUSPENSION AND MODIFICATION OF LAWS RELATING TO THE DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Frank Thomas as the previous Warren County Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, issued Executive Order 2 of 2020, pursuant to Section 24 of the Executive Law of the State of New York, that the public safety was sufficiently imperiled such that a Proclamation of Emergency was declared within the territorial limits of Warren County; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2020, pursuant to 10 NYCRR Section 2.1(a), Dr. Howard A. Zucker, as Commissioner of Health of the State of New York, designated 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) as a communicable disease under the State Sanitary Code; and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2020, the New York State Public Health and Health Planning Council ratified the designation of 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) as a communicable disease under the New York Sanitary Code through the adoption of emergency regulations amending 10 NYCRR Section 2.1; and

WHEREAS, as a direct result of the Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) pandemic and upon the recommendation of health officials, the Warren County Clerk's Office has been operating under a reduced employee capacity; and

WHEREAS, the Warren County Board of Supervisors have been holding virtual meetings via the Zoom platform, with reduced public hearings for the same reason;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rachel Seeber, Chairwoman of the Warren County Board of Supervisors, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the State and Local Law, and in furtherance of my statutory duties, hereby modify Section 3 of Warren County Local Law 5 of 2019 to extend the effective date of the Local Law to February 1, 2021.

This Order is necessary to prevent the hindrance or delay of necessary action in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and recovering therefrom. This Order is intended to comply with all laws and regulation, state, and federal, and shall be read and interpreted in such manner.

As the law requires, this Order shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless sooner rescinded or modified by me as Chairwoman of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Warren, but may be extended for additional periods not to exceed five (5) days each during the pendency of this local state of emergency.
